Dear fellow Lions of 201T1,

Having just returned from the semi-annual meeting of the Multiple District committee meeting in Sydney I'm pleased to be able to report that our District appears to be in good shape with more clubs starting to support the programs by way of donations and per capita levies. Fifty percent of the clubs in our district are now donors to this worthwhile project which compares more than favourably with other districts. There were others who attended the training days in August 2014 who are also knowledgeable enough to spread the word and haven't offered to take on the role of Ambassador. Whilst this is a waste of a resource, time and circumstances play a part in the reason why it has happened.

It is amazing how just one address leads to others. *The Burnie Soroptimist International Club* invited me to speak to them about our program. When question time was called, it was the children's section that drew the most comments. Many of the members commented that they had noticed their grandchildren experiencing vision problems that their parents hadn't. Then looking at the members sitting there, all bar one was forty or older, most wore glasses, and all had been to either an ophthalmologist or optometrist in the last two years. One was a diabetic and that visit alone detected retinopathy.

From that came an invitation to address a senior citizens club. Expecting ten or at most twenty members, I was confronted with close to fifty. I had to look twice to see if I was in a church to deliver a sermon. So word of mouth helps especially to women's groups who talk to one another where we men as usual forget about it.

So what about contacts to Rotary, Probus, and Senior Citizen clubs in your local areas, let them know we are available to speak to them. All we need is the invitations to do so!

#### Recycle For Sight:

I have asked clubs and Zone Chair persons to let me know which clubs in the district collect spectacles for recycling.

Would you believe that the only way I have found out so far is being engaged in conversation with other Lions. Nothing heard directly from the clubs of 201T1 or the Zone Chairpersons.

I would also love to know how many are leaving Tasmania to be processed in Brisbane for distribution.

The Recycle for Sight (R4S) project. So far ten (10) clubs have returned stats of this project at least five others are searching for details to get back with and I've heard nothing from thirty-two (32) clubs who are possibly waiting to discuss at either board or a dinner meeting before getting back to me.

The year 2013 - 2014 so far produced 12,335+ pairs and for the year to date, 8349+ pairs from just 10 clubs so far.

Just last week I collected another 160 pairs and I do the rounds on a monthly basis of four optometrists.
