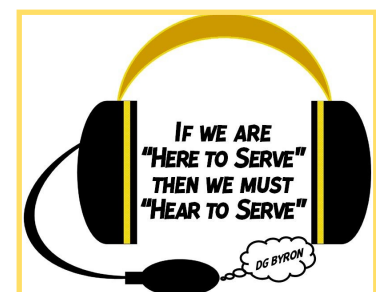

During last month all Clubs will have received a supply of small change donation envelopes.

Collectively small change will add up to significant funds for LCIF enabling through the grants programme to assist Lions in their community service. **Even small amounts will assist Clubs in meeting Club Excellence for the current year.**

Also, in recent weeks, Clubs have been advised of the January recommendation of our Council of Governors, for Clubs to donate 50% of their Christmas Cake profits to LCIF.

COVID-safe Behaviours

We all have the opportunity and a responsibility to protect lives and livelihoods by maintaining 'COVID-safe behaviours' – it's that simple and yet, incredibly effective.

As a community, we are all learning how to live with COVID-19 for the foreseeable future. The threat from this virus will remain until a vaccine becomes available. This means that whilst we have been able to return to doing some things as normal there are a few restrictions and behaviours that we will have to keep up over the long term. Each and every Tasmanian has an important role to play. Our actions will determine Tasmania's future, the protection of vulnerable people and the response to potential cases and outbreaks.

There are 5 key behaviours that we must all be aware of and follow, every day. These behaviours will ensure that we lower the risks and continue to save lives during the pandemic. Remember them, remind your family and friends about them and keep them up.

- 1 Stay at least 1.5 metres away from others when outside your home.
- 2 Wash your hands often with soap and warm, running water. Use alcohol based hand sanitiser when out.
- 3 Stay at home if you are unwell and always cover coughs and sneezes.
- 4 Get tested for COVID-19 if you have any cold or flu-like symptoms.
- 5 Be aware of, and follow, current gathering, business and travel restrictions.

40TH ANNIVERSARY

1980 – 2020

This year would have been a memorable year in South Australia, the Lions Multiple District Convention was booked to be held in Adelaide. But, 2020 was very significant for another very special reason, the Australian Lions Hearing Dogs Centre was celebrating “40 Years” of training and delivering Hearing Assistance Dogs to the Deaf and Hard of Hearing people of Australia, therefore, what better way than to coincide our celebrations with the Multiple District Convention.

With Lions & partners from all over Australia and beyond arriving in Adelaide for Convention, we had the perfect opportunity of showcasing our Hearing Dog program and Training Centre to the Conventioneers.

Guided tours of the Training Centre were included each day in the partner’s tours, our CEO David Horne was to address Conventioneers on the Opening day, plus our Convention Display Stand was set for an eye-catching display with Trainers and Hearing Dogs, **Foster Puppies with their Carers plus plenty of our merchandise and the launch of our 2021 Calendar – which is always released at MD Convention.**

On Saturday Night the Gala Dinner, provided us our chance to celebrate together, so several tables were booked to accommodate Staff, Volunteers and attending Board Members.

We were so sure that this Convention in Adelaide was going to be the one to remember - it was!! - but, not for what we expected it to be remembered for.

Just weeks prior to the Convention, the whole world turned topsy-turvy. Suddenly our world as we had known it had changed. All events, meetings etc. cancelled. Confusion and uncertainty was all around us, as our respective State Governments implemented restrictions and lockdowns, attempting to combat the spread of the Covid19 virus. **A dreadful time was upon us...**

But Lions are resilient, they don’t like to sit doing nothing and neither do the Management and staff at the Hearing Dogs Centre! **So, with the staff practicing social distancing, it’s been “business as usual” and Dog deliveries only to South Australia, Western Australia, & Queensland.**

Deliveries to Eastern States ceased because of locked borders, although we have several ready and waiting to go to NSW and Victoria. Currently twenty (20) dogs are in training and all need to be exercised, fed, cared for, etc., nine (9) puppies are in “Foster Care” (private homes around Adelaide, until they are about eight (8) months old).

Our Goal is to deliver 30 dogs for this year and to mid October, we have delivered twenty-three (23). **We will beat last year’s record of twenty-three (23)!**

The Birth of Lions International - 1917

Melvin Jones was born on January 13, 1879 in Fort Thomas, Arizona, the son of a United States Army captain who commanded a troop of scouts.

Later, his father was transferred and the family moved east. As a young man, Melvin Jones made his home in Chicago, Illinois, became associated with an insurance firm and in 1913 formed his own agency.

He soon joined the Business Circle, a businessmen's luncheon group, and was shortly elected secretary. This group was one of many at that time devoted solely to promoting the financial interests of their membership.

Because of their limited appeal, they were destined to disappear. Melvin Jones, then a 38-year-old Chicago business leader, had other plans.

"What if these men," Melvin Jones asked, "who are successful because of their drive, intelligence and ambition, were to put their talents to work improving their communities?"

Thus, at his invitation, delegates from men's clubs met in Chicago to lay the groundwork for such an organization and on June 7, 1917, Lions Clubs International was born.

Melvin Jones eventually abandoned his insurance agency to devote himself full time to Lions at International Headquarters in Chicago. It was under his dynamic leadership, that Lions clubs earned the prestige necessary to attract civic-minded members.

The association's founder was also recognized as a leader by those outside the association. One of his greatest honors was in 1945 when he represented Lions Clubs International as a consultant in San Francisco, California, at the organization of the United Nations.

Melvin Jones, the man whose personal code – *"You can't get very far until you start doing something for somebody else"* – became a guiding principle for public-spirited people the world over, died June 1, 1961 at 82 years of age.

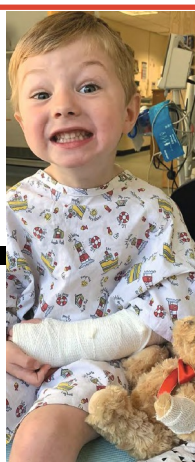
Arthur's parents, Robert and Sarah, would like to say thank you to Whitstable and Herne Bay Lions Club.
